BULLDOG ROBOTICS COMPETES at Vermont Regional Championship

On Saturday, Mater Christi Middle School's Bulldog Robotics Club participated in the Vermont Regional Championship at South Burlington High School. The event was part of the FIRST Tech Challenge, themed "Into the Deep," a high school-level robotics competition that challenges students to design, build, and program a robot to complete a series of tasks.

Over the past three months, Bulldog Robotics worked diligently to construct their robot, named Brinicle—after a rare cold ocean phenomenon. The robot was designed to autonomously navigate to a specific parking position, retrieve and transport samples to designated scoring regions under remote control, and, in the final 30 seconds of the game, climb onto the bottom rung of the center structure and hang.

During the competition, teams formed alliances to maximize their scores in fast-paced, two-and-a-half-minute matches. Each team played five matches with different partners, and their cumulative scores determined their overall ranking. The top-scoring teams advanced to the semi-final rounds to compete for the championship title.

Brinicle was both a striking and capable robot. While it may have been slower than some of the other competitors, it was exceptionally durable and required no repairs or reprogramming throughout the event. The team also participated in an interview with judges, presenting their engineering portfolio, which detailed the design and development of their robot.

The day began early at 7:30 AM with the judging interview, followed by field and robot inspections. Competition rounds started at 10 AM and continued throughout the day. Through every challenge, Bulldog Robotics demonstrated "gracious professionalism"—a core value of FIRST Tech Challenge that emphasizes respect, cooperation, and sportsmanship, even in the face of competition.

Congratulations to Bulldog Robotics for their hard work, dedication, and outstanding performance at the Vermont Regional Championship!
